Submission 30 October 2022

We notice with interest the letters received from TTPP to several homes on Old Christchurch Road, all received on or around the 18th of October 2022. These were specifically addressed to us regarding our properties and the significance of our properties to Māori.

- 1. We are concerned that although your letter is specifically addressed to us it makes no statement specifically as what the significance of our property is to Māori.
 - We also note SASM 104 Kawhaka Creek catchment claims (Pounamu legends and Ancestors embedded in the landscape) Please clarify this, as it is unclear what is meant by "Ancestors embedded in the landscape" means?
- 2. Considering that the land has been previously mined (change in landscape) and occupied and mostly consist of a riverbed, how are Tupuna embedded in the current landscape?
- 3. Further to this we note that this is going to be put on our LIM reports. We believe that this would significantly decrease the value of our land. Should we in the future want to sell our property we would be negatively impacted. Why does it need to be on our LIM reports?
- 4. What compensation is going to be put in place, should it impact the value of our properties and the ability to sell our properties?
- 5. Is there a proposal for compensation, how is this going to be calculated?
- 6. Are we going to be consulted as to how compensation is going to be calculated?
- 7. Additionally, our properties were bought without any encumberments, why were we not told at the time of purchase that this was going to happen?
- 8. Why were we as property owners not advised at the time when TTPP was set up, back in 2019? This has been an ambush situation which is not acceptable!
- 9. Why were we not advised that we are funding actions against our own property by the regional council, and TTPP. ie this is now on our Rates Bill.
- 10. When did we start funding actions against ourselves? And why were we not consulted?
- 11. Who is this driven by? Local council or government?
- 12. Who has set the agenda, why were we not consulted or given an opportunity to participate, there has been no partnership, nor have our rights been protected. Principles of Te Tiriti O Waitangi is about Participation, Partnership

and Protection why were we not given the opportunity to have these extended to us as current landowners?

- 13. What is the bigger picture here, what is not being disclosed now to us as property holders?
- 14. As we understand the Arahura river was granted/ gifted to Māori in 1998 by the New Zealand government. Why were the significant areas of interest not addressed by the then Iwi representatives at the time. Why Now?
- 15. How were the areas marked on the map? What formula or methodology was used to establish the highlighted areas; they make no sense.
- 16. Activities Rule SASM R5 this is noted as blank, what does this mean for us as property holders.
- 17. Schedule three is blank, so we can assume with confidence that this is not going to change and will remain blank? without further encumberments being placed on our property?

The concern from our perspective is that the process is not tika (right) nor pono (true)

We are concerned that the process has not transparent that there is an agenda that is not being disclosed.

We understand that there has been considerable research done over the past 3 years. There is no way we as individuals the we have the resources or the time to research our position with such short notice.

Our land is our land, we have worked on it for a significant period of time. It is not just the value of the land, it is the work and labour that has gone into it, the memories it has to us, and the significance it holds for our families and whanau.

It is leaving us with a feeling of being disenfranchised, disempowered, with no participation or voice.

The expectation for us to submit our concerns with no appropriate time frames when this has been in the works for three years is not agreeable, it is an ambush.
