Submission – proposed Te Tai o Poutini Plan - Sites and Areas of Significance to Maori

Re property:

- Lot 1 DP 2609 BLK 1 Waiwhero SD subj to QE II National Trust Open Space Covenant
- Lot 1 DP 3122 BLK 1 Punakaiki SD & BLK 1 Waiwhero SD subj to QE II National Trust Open Space Covenant
- Lot 2 DP 3122 BLK 1 Punakaiki SD & BLK 1 Waiwhero SD subj to QE II National Trust Open Space Covenant

The proposed Te Tai Poutini Plan identifies that the above properties are located within a site or area of significance to Maori (SASM).

We are the owners of the above properties and object to their inclusion within SASM33.

The grounds for our objection are that;

- 1. The properties contain no sites or areas of significance to Maori that could support them being zoned in the proposed Te Tai o Poutini District Plan as sites or areas of significance to Maori.
- The inclusion of the properties within the proposed zone SASM 33 is not evidence based. The proposed Te Tai o Poutini District Plan provides no evidence that there has ever been any Maori activity on the properties that could support them being zoned as sites or areas of significance to Maori.
- 3. The West Coast Regional Council map of Pakiroa Beach SASM33 and Schedule 3 of the proposed Te Tai o Poutini District Plan are in error. They infer that the properties are at Pakiroa beach and retain kainga sites. The properties are not at Pakiroa beach and there is no evidence that kainga sites existed on them.

- 4. The proposed plan where it concerns the properties fails to provide any source documentation upon which its zoning has been based.
- 5. The West Coast Regional Council map for Pakiroa Beach showing SASM33, and the proposed Te Tai o Poutini District Plan – Environmental and Cultural Values maps 34 and 39 showing SASM33, fail to identify the location of any specific sites of significance to Maori and the SASM boundaries are otherwise vague and arbitrary.
- 6. The proposed Te Tai o Poutini District Plan fails to provide any specific explanation for the inclusion of the properties within SASM33.
- 7. Our objection is supported by The West Coast Regional Council disclaimer, that the database and maps used to classify the properties within SASM33 may be inaccurate and incomplete. We agree and maintain that district plans must be based on quantifiable evidence.

For the above reasons we request that the above properties be removed from the proposed SASMs.

We wish to be heard in support of this submission.
