Proposed Te Tai o Poutini Plan Consultation



What is Te Tai o Poutini Plan?

- An Order in Council, following a request from West Coast residents to central government, directed the preparation of a combined district plan for the region
- Te Tai o Poutini Plan (TTPP) is the planning rulebook for land use and subdivision for the Buller, Grey and Westland Districts
- This work has been overseen by the TTPP Committee.
- The TTPP Committee is made up of the Mayor and one other elected member from each of the Buller, Grey and Westland District Councils, the Chair and one other elected member from the West Coast Regional Council, the Chairs of both the West Coast Runanga and an Independent Chair
- A Technical Advisory Group (planners) represents the same organisations of the Committee.

Where we are up to

- An 'Exposure Draft' of the Plan was released in January 2022
- Community and stakeholder feedback was received up until April 2022
- The Committee updated the Plan based on the feedback received on the Exposure Draft
 The Proposed TTPP was notified on 14 July 2022
- The Proposed Plan has some legal status with some rules taking immediate legal effect. Most rules do not.
- > Submission period open until 30 September 2022

How to make a submission

- Submissions close at 5.00pm on Friday 30 September 2022
- You can make a submission via:
 - the online submission tool available at https://ttpp.nz
 - using the hard copy form and emailing it to info@ttpp.nz or posting it to Te Tai Poutini Plan Submissions, PO Box 66, Greymouth 7840
- · It does not have to be detailed, prepared by a planner or a lawyer
- It does have to be on the submission form with all required fields completed.
- Submitters need to confirm if they wish to present their feedback
- in person during the hearing process.

 Note the information on a submission form is made available.

What happens next?

- After the submission period closes, **submissions are summarised** and notified
- Once the summary of submissions is released, a **further submission** to either support or oppose a matter in someone else's submission can be made. This can only be done if you have an interest that is *more than the public interest in general,* or if you are *representing a relevant aspect of the public interest*
- Planners review each submission point, and make recommendations as to whether change is required in the Plan
- If submitters have requested to be heard in support of their submission a hearing will be held. Hearing Commissioners will consider the submissions and hear any evidence that supports the
- Hearing Commissioners prepare their recommendations

What happens next?

- Once the TTPP Committee makes a **decision** on the Commissioner recommendations, the content of the Proposed Plan is finalised and will be publicly notified.
- Submitters have the right to lodge an **appeal** on the decision with the Environment Court on any matter or content a submitter
- The Proposed Plan becomes **fully operative** after the Committee has made its decision and all appeals, if there are any, have been resolved.
- Parts of the Plan that are 'beyond challenge' (because no submissions opposed it or no appeals were lodged on it) are treated as operative even if the whole plan is not fully operative.

If you want to be involved in the TTPP process you need to make a submission.
