### 1. Submitters

- 1.1 On behalf of Birchfield Coal Mines Ltd (the submitter), I submit on the proposed Te Tai o Poutini Plan (the Proposed Plan).
- 1.2 The submitter could not gain an advantage in trade competition through this submission.
- 1.3 The submitter owns multiple land holdings in the West Coast Region, and in addition has numerous Resource Consents, Minerals Permits, Coal Mining Licences, Ancillary Coal Mining Licences and other lawfully established and operating activities.
- 1.4 This submission covers all of the Proposed Plan, and in particular those provisions which affect the submitter and its businesses.
- 1.5 The reasons for the submission and the relief sought are set out below and comprehensive provision by provision detail is included in the attached table in the template provided by the West Coast Regional Council.
- 1.6 The suggested revisions do not limit the generality of the reasons for the submission.
- 1.7 The submitter wishes to be heard in support of this submission.
- 1.8 The submitter will consider presenting a joint case with others presenting similar submissions.

### 2. Background to the submission

- 2.1 Birchfield Coal Mines Limited (Birchfield Coal) is a family owned and operated coal mining company based on the West Coast. Birchfield Coal owns and operates two active opencast coal mines Giles Creek and Strongman. It has the Island Block Mine in Care and Maintenance and the Strongman East Mine under active development.
- 2.2 Birchfield Coal also operates two alluvial gold mines within the West Coast Region.
- 2.3 The variety in coal mined from Birchfield Coal operations mean the submitters can produce a variety of different blends that are suitable for a wide range of use. The company supplies coal to the South Island domestic market. This consists of hospitals, schools, dairy factories, swimming pools, aged care facilities and numerous smaller horticultural businesses meaning the business is an important contributor in ensuring businesses in various industries across the South Island can operate.
- 2.4 In 2017 the submitter acquired several Solid Energy New Zealand assets, with a number of these assets including rehabilitation liabilities. Work continues to ensure these sites are appropriately rehabilitated to meet high environmental standards.
- 2.5 The submitter also operates several coal distributions centres across the West Coast and the wider South Island. This includes the Reefton, Mai Mai, Ikamatua, Rocky Creek and Kaiata sites.
- 2.6 Birchfield Coal is of regional and South Island importance given the dependence that a number of industries and individuals have on this steady supply of quality coal. It is of regional importance as an employer, contributing significantly to the economic and social wellbeing of its over 90 staff across the region.
- 2.7 Birchfield Coal are working with the New Zealand Institute for Minerals to Materials Research to develop alternative uses for coal, which result in no CO2 emissions and would extend the demand for coal products beyond any proposed phase out of coal use by the New Zealand Government. This demonstrates that the importance of coal mining to the West Coast region and further afield will endure and must be provided for in any regulatory documents affecting development in the region.
- 2.8 The submitters have land or other interests which are located within the General Rural Zone, Industrial Zone, Open Space Zone, Mineral Extraction Zone. Their interests are affected by multiple overlays, including Outstanding Natural Landscapes, Significant Natural Areas, Outstanding Coastal Natural Character, Coastal Environment, Sites and Areas of Significance to Maori.

### 3. Summary of submission

3.1 The submitters have carefully considered the Proposed Plan, and support a number of provisions which generally align with the provisions that the submitters were consulted on during the pre-notification phase of the Proposed Plan development. However, some provisions have been included which were not consulted upon, and which affect the application of the provisions which were consulted on. These include the overlay chapters, including Outstanding Natural Landscapes, Significant Natural Areas, Outstanding Coastal Natural Character, Coastal Environment, Sites and Areas of Significance to Maori.

- 3.2 As a result, the Proposed Plan contains provisions which are restrictive, and in some cases prohibitive, for both current and future mining operations. Where zone frameworks provide for a more enabling framework, some overlays override the zone provisions which were consulted on.
- 3.3 Minerals extraction activities (and prospecting and exploration) are limited geographically. They only occur where a resource exists, and thus have functional and operational requirements to operate within the Proposed Plan overlays. Including Outstanding Natural Landscapes and Outstanding Coastal Natural Character and Significant Natural Areas. National planning documents and policy statements recognise the functional and operational need for some fixed-in-location activities to occur, usually subject to applying an effects management hierarchy, despite being located in areas that may otherwise be protected. The current wording of the Proposed Plan does not adequately provide for this. Multiple submission points have been made to address this.
- 3.4 The submitter considers that the Proposed Plan does not give effect to the enabling framework set by the recent West Coast Regional Policy Statement 2020 (RPS), which provides for economic development and activity, while also seeking to protect the environment. The RPS also seeks to avoid unnecessary duplication of regulation between the District and Regional Councils, and the submitter notes that there are a number of provisions throughout the plan which seek to manage the effects of odour, dust and water quality, which do not achieve this intent.
- 3.5 The submission seeks specific relief to ensure there is a consenting pathway for the submitters' current and future mining operations, and recognition of the significance of the mining industry to the West Coast Region as it underpins economic and social wellbeing. Mining and the industries which support it provide job stability and high wage employment, retention of talent and people, foster social connections and are a vital component of the West Coast community. The Proposed Plan needs to support this industry, as the preceding three District Plans have done for the past 15 years.
- 3.6 The submission supports aspects of the Proposed Plan which recognise the importance of the mining industry, and seeks amendments to aspects which are problematic or restrictive.
- 3.7 The submitter is concerned at the accuracy of the planning maps in relation to the overlays, including Outstanding Natural Landscapes and Outstanding Coastal Natural Character. It is clear in many cases that these mapping lines are arbitrary and require review and amendment. Such overlays should not encroach on existing industrial activities, because by default these sites are already highly modified and lacking sufficient natural character to be classified as outstanding.

### 4. Reasons for the submission

4.1 The submitters primary concern with making a submission on the Proposed Plan is to ensure that the significance its activities to the West Coast Region is expressly recognised, and that these activities are able to operate efficiently and effectively (and in a way which its functional and operational needs are recognised), including through securing resource consents as appropriate.

4.2 Some specific reasons for each of the provisions where relief is sought are also enclosed in the table attached as Appendix 1 to this submission.

### 5. Relief sought

- 5.1 The submitter seeks any and all relief required to give effect to the matters raised in this submission and in Appendix 1, including as affected by introduced national environmental standards and national policy statements. Relief sought specifically includes but is not limited to the relief sought enclosed in the table attached as Appendix 1 to this submission.
- 5.2 Alternative, consequential, or necessary additional relief to give effect to the matters raised generally in this submission and in Appendix 1, and to address any matters affected by introduced by national environmental standards and national policy statements.
