Te Tai o Poutini Plan Supplementary Statement from Reporting Officer Coastal Environment



Supplementary Statement in relation to the Extent of the Coastal Environment

- Following the 1st day of the coastal environment hearing and in further considering the
 discussion around the extent of the coastal environment and the relationship with the direction of
 the NZCPS I wish to amend my recommendations in relation to excluding the urban areas of
 Westport, Hokitika and Greymouth from the coastal environment.
- 2. This is because while, as drafted in the proposed Plan, the coastal environment rules do not apply, the proposed Plan framework enables an assessment of the relevant objectives and policies from the coastal environment chapter where a resource consent is triggered for activities occurring within this area. I consider this is appropriate and consistent with the intention of the NZCPS.
- 3. I have undertaken analysis of the 8 most recent district plans (prepared consistent with the national planning standards) and where there is an urban area adjacent to the coast all but one of these identifies the extent of the coastal environment within urban locations. The approach in these plans is outlined in the table below.

- 4. The s42A report discusses this matter at paragraph 545 and includes 4 maps which I now do not recommend as amendments to the Plan.
- 5. I therefore would like to withdraw the recommendations in paragraph 547 of the Coastal Environment s42A report.
- 6. This amends my recommendations on submissions, and on changes to the Plan in the following
- 7. I now do not support the following submissions:
 - Grey District Council (\$608.079, \$608.004),
 - Buller District Council (S538.310),
 - Westpower Limited (S547.414, S547.014)
 - Misato Nomura (S151.010),
 - Joanne and Ken Dixon (S213.005),
 - John Brazil (\$360.026)
 - Kyle Avery (\$509.062) (and other similar submissions from other submitters).
- 8. The s42A report makes a consequential amendment to Policy CE P6 which I would now like to withdraw. I therefore I recommended that Policy CE P6 is amended as follows (changes from the s42A report highlighted in yellow)

CE - P6

Recognise that there are existing settlements and urban areas located within the coastal environment of the West Coast/Te Tai o Poutini including parts areas on the edges of Westport, Greymouth and Hokitika and enable new subdivision, buildings and structures use and development within and expansion of towns and settlements where:

- a. These <u>activities</u> are located in areas already modified by built development or primary production activities, or
- b. Where located in unmodified areas, any adverse impact on natural character can be mitigated;
- c. In areas of outstanding or high natural character:
 - i. Provide for lawfully established land uses and activities to continue;
 - ii. Allow for other uses with a functional need or operational need to locate in the coastal environment;
 - iii. Allow for Poutini Ngāi Tahu cultural uses Activities and Māori Purpose Activities;
 - iv. Avoid encroachment into unmodified areas of the coastal environment; and
 - v. Ensure subdivision and development is of a scale and design where adverse effects on the elements, patterns and processes that contribute to natural character are minimised avoided, remedied or mitigated.
