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Costal Natural Hazards Mapping

I am not submitting to your fear of climate change. I am opposing your approach.

I have voted for you as Government, Local or National to represent me in ensuring that my best interests as a rate payer and resident is being taken care of. In my opinion the Coastal Natural Hazards Mapping and plan is inflammatory with doses of fear mongering. As a Health Consultant this type of legislation will have far reaching impacts on the health of all New Zealanders who live close to a river, estuary, coastline or may have a perceived hazard near their property.

The reason I fear for the health impacts of my community and the rest of New Zealand is that this Proposed mapping will in effect cause Insurance companies to no longer insure property in these zones and therefore Banks will refuse mortgages. The people affected will not be able to sell to anyone needing a mortgage therefore the property prices will be affected. Many people will be adversely compromised financially. As this is a nation-wide proposal and as New Zealand is mostly costal, with many rivers and estuaries with earthquake risks as well I am concerned this mapping advice will have far reaching implications for most New Zealanders. The ridiculous idea that councils will be able to reimburse residents in their managed retreat is the part I see as inflammatory. As a rate payer how is this Buller Council going to afford this they are already in so much in debt.

In the area of Little Wanganui and Karamea this hazard plan has not yet been mapped with the updated system so I find it hard to believe we are being expected to SUBMIT? To you something when we don't know the final outcome of the mapping.

- 1. I propose all residents north of Hector who have not had this final mapping are allowed to propose another solution once they know what the final mapping has been completed.
- 2. I propose the Commissioners of this Variation come to the area to speak about why they believe this is in our best interests and outline how it is to be enacted.

I have chosen to live in this area and have no intention of moving into a city designated by elected officials. I as all New Zealanders have done, know the inherent risks of living on the shaky isles of a Coastal Island. I am confident in my community and it's resilience we are well prepared for the possible eventualities. My question to this TTPP group who I did not elect is why did our Education Board spend \$9-15 million on a new school in Karamea in a flood zone then expect it's residents to wear the costs of rezoning?

Beware if you make it impossible for people to have a mortgage and not be able to sell you may find these people not able to pay your taxes or rates?

The Health of all New Zealanders will be impacted with the stress of uncertainty about a fundamental right to have a home. Have your TTPP Commissioners factored into the costs on our health system as opposed to a possible 100 year flood or Antarctic Sea Rising? Recently we had a well-known Geologist come to Karamea and spoke of how New Zealand is rising with the force of the techtonic plates, has that science been looked into?
