

Recommended Changes to Definitions

Below shows the changes to the notified Natural Hazards chapter as recommended by the s42A report. The changes in **red** are the changes that were recommended in the Natural Hazards Section 42A report. The changes in **blue** are those recommended in the Coastal Hazards Section 42A Report. Also included are changes recommended in the Rebuttal Evidence for the Natural Hazards Chapter in **purple**, the Right of Reply for the Natural Hazards Chapter in **orange**, and the Rebuttal Evidence for Variation 2 – Coastal Hazards in **green**.

Term	Definition
ADDITIONS AND ALTERATIONS	means ; a. in relation to natural hazards, changes to a building or structure that alters the habitable space in such a way as to increase the likely number of inhabitants. For example, increasing the number of bedrooms, but not the size of bedrooms, or converting a garage to a bedroom but not increasing the size of a garage; and¹ b. in relation to historic heritage items, changes to the extent, floor levels, form, proportion and scale of the item, or changes to the design, texture, or form of the fabric of the item.
<u>ANNUAL EXCEEDANCE PROBABILITY (AEP)</u>	<u>means the probability of an event occurring in any given year.²</u>
BROWNFIELD	means land that has been developed and therefore has existing infrastructure.

CRITICAL RESPONSE FACILITIES	<p>means, in relation to natural hazards, hospitals, fire, rescue, police stations, buildings intended to be used in an emergency for shelter, operations or response, hazardous or explosive material storage, aviation control towers, air traffic control centres, emergency aircraft hangars, fuel storage, major dams, community scale potable water treatment facilities and wastewater treatment facilities.</p> <p><u>Note: This definition does not apply to Community Emergency Centres Community Facilities when it is not the main purpose of the building.⁴</u></p>
<u>GREEN INFRASTRUCTURE</u>	<p><u>means a natural or semi-natural area, feature or process, including engineered systems that mimic natural processes, which are planned or managed to:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. <u>provide for aspects of ecosystem health or resilience, such as maintaining or improving the quality of water, air or soil, and habitats to promote biodiversity; and</u> b. <u>provide services to people and communities, such as stormwater or flood management or climate change adaptation.</u>
<u>HAZARD SENSITIVE ACTIVITY</u>	<p><u>means buildings accommodating:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. <u>Residential Activity, including residential units, respite care, and rehabilitation housing.</u> b. <u>Visitor Accommodation and Worker Accommodation</u> c. <u>Retirement Home-Village</u> d. <u>Healthcare Facility and Medical Activities</u> e. <u>Community Facility</u> f. <u>Educational Facility</u> g. <u>Marae⁵</u> h. <u>Critical Response Facility</u> i. <u>Visitor Accommodation</u> j. <u>Sleep Outs</u> k. <u>Childcare services, including kohanga reo</u>

Crematoriums and Funeral Homes</u> <u>d. Entertainment Facility</u> <u>e. Food and Beverage Activity</u> <u>f. Industrial Activities Activity</u> <u>g. <u>SEVERE NATURAL HAZARD OVERLAY</u>	<u>means either one or a combination of the mapped extents of the Severe Flood Overlay, Earthquake Severe Overlay and Coastal Severe Overlay Coastal Hazard Erosion and Inundation Overlay.</u>
